New website encourages people to go online with .nz

A new website developed by NZRS has been launched to help individuals and SMEs go online.

The website – www.getyourselfonline.co.nz – offers clear, practical advice on how to get a domain name and, for businesses, how to grow online. On the website, users can search for available .nz domain names and choose from one of the many companies that provide .nz domain registration and other online services.



NZRS Marketing and Channels Manager David Morrison says the website provides New Zealand businesses with the information they need to get started and connect with those who can help.

"For businesses with a New Zealand focus, a .nz domain is an important part of connecting with customers.

"However, recent research shows that SMEs need support to get online," Morrison says.

Findings in the NZRS-commissioned research show that two thirds of New Zealand businesses do not have a domain name for use with email or a website, and 57 percent of businesses don't know how to register a domain name.

"There is a significant disconnect between how the public use the Internet as a vital source of information for products and services and how businesses engage online," says Morrison.

DNC Staff attend Black Hat 2013

DNC Manager of Security Policy Barry Brailey recently attended this year's Black Hat Briefings in Las Vegas, USA. The Black Hat Briefings are a series of technical information security conferences that gather thought leaders from the corporate, government and academic world.

"The briefing sessions are led by some of the most respected experts in the world and keep DNC on top of Internet security developments. While not a significant issue in New Zealand at this time, one interesting piece of research at the conference identified changes in approach to malicious fast flux domains. Fast flux is a method used by malicious domains to avoid detection," Barry says.

"Fast flux domains used to change their IP address about every 10 minutes or less to evade detection. However, IP address changing is now much slower, the average is over one hour and there is greater sharing of IP addresses within fast flux infrastructure".
